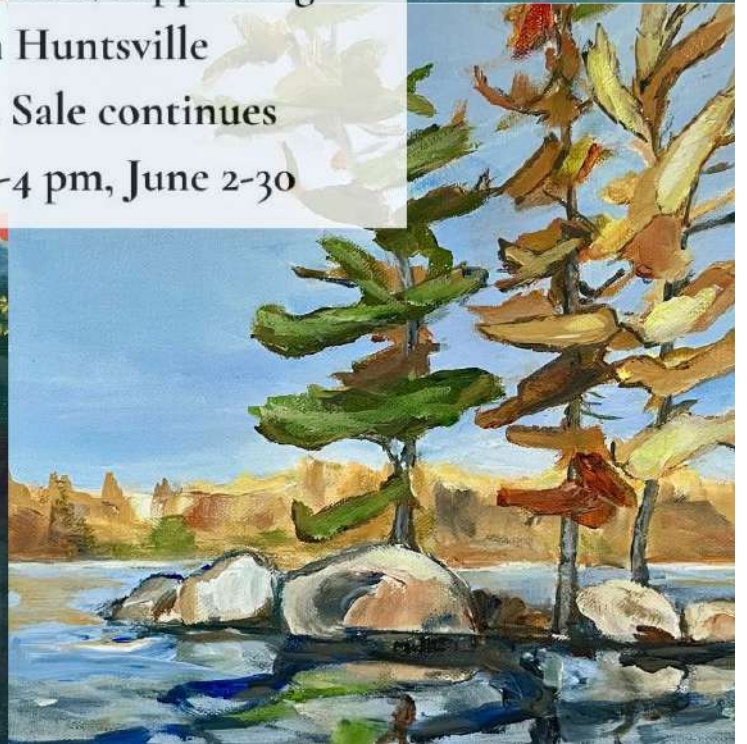

ANDREA TAYLOR

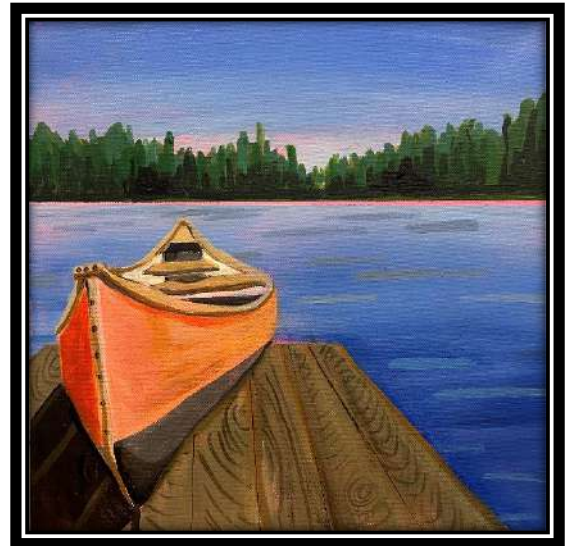

CHERIN HARRIS-TUCK

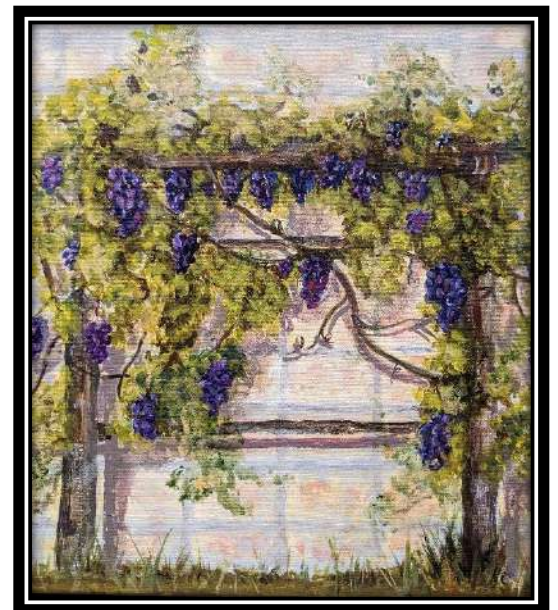

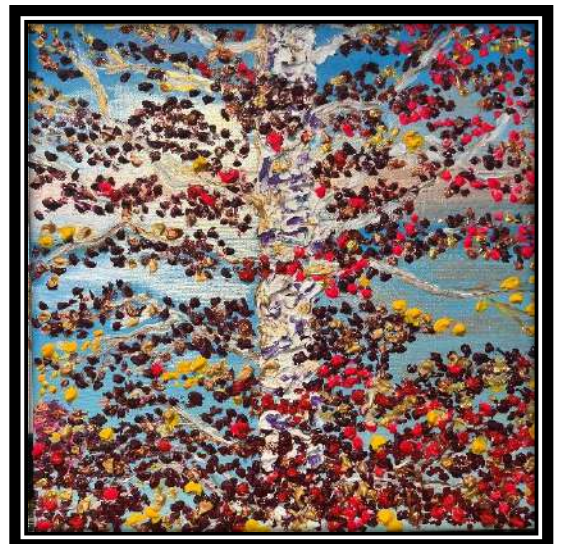

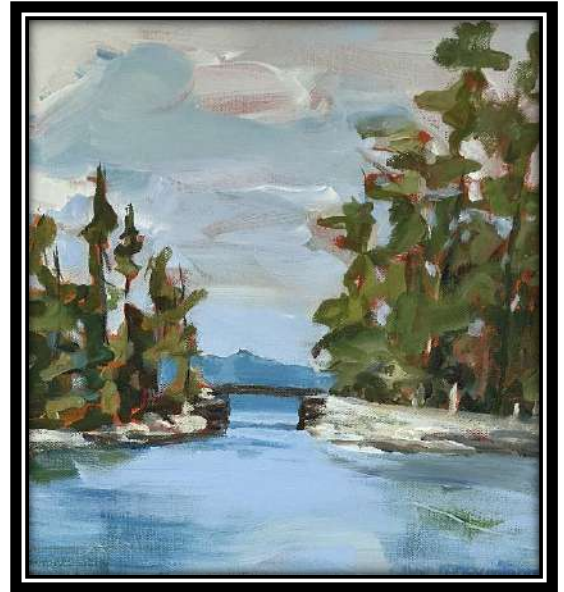

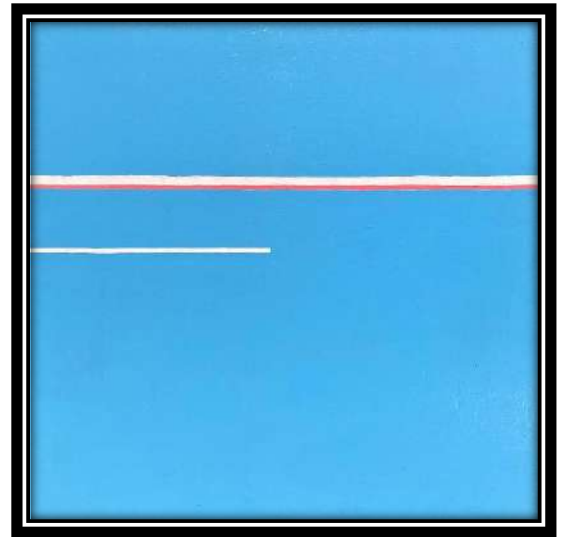

TIFFANY MONK

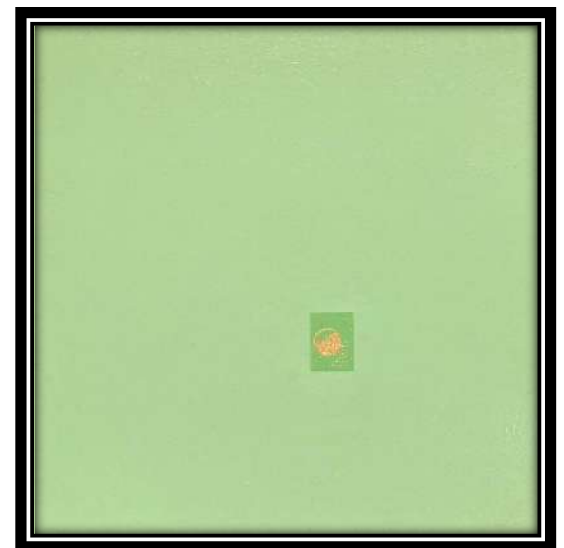

A few summer courses at the Haliburton School of Art and Design allowed him to develop his style within the genre of “loose impressionistic watercolour.” Surrounded by rock, waterways, and tree, Tom has all the inspiration he needs, in all four seasons, to render what he sees through the magic of his chosen medium. He often mounts his paintings in “repurposed” frames keeping the cost of ownership to a minimum. They are “ready to hang.” Lately he has experimented with mounting his paintings without mats or glass. This involves using a watercolour wax to make the surfaces waterproof. The three paintings in Square Foot North show are examples of this. Tom hopes you feel a personal connection to some of these images and enjoy looking at them as much as he has creating them. 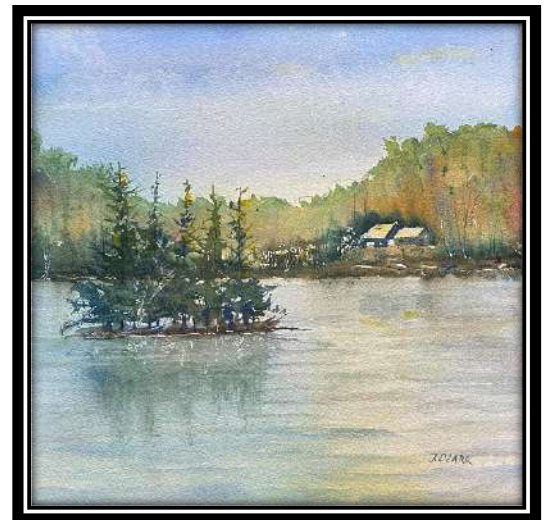
